Michael Quinn trains law enforcement agencies and lectures internationally in the areas of police ethics and accountability with a specific focus on peer intervention/active bystandership. Michael was a police officer in Minneapolis for 23 years, retiring as a sergeant. He went on to work with the Minnesota Department of Public Safety for two years and the U.S. Marshal's Service for 5 years. Over his many years of service, he instructed in the areas of SWAT, Advanced SWAT, officer survival, firearms, deadly force, defensive tactics, chemical agents, and other law enforcement skills. His course on chemical agents was adopted by agencies across the country, including Los Angeles SWAT. He has over 37 years of experience in police training teaching academic and skills related courses. Michael wrote an ethics column for Officer.com for two years and continues to blog and comment on current police practices.

Michael served for over 30 years as an advisory board member of the Hibbing Community College Law Enforcement Advisory Board and is currently serving on the board for Inver Hills Community College.
